

DEATH OF MISS EMMA ALLEN

Dear Editor: Will you allow me space in your paper to record the death of Miss Emma Allen of Whitney, S. C., as she has many friends and relatives in Madison County who might read it.

She quietly passed away Saturday evening, May 12 at 5:15 p. m., after an illness of eight weeks in which she suffered, no one can tell how much.
