TAKEN BY DEATH

On Monday evening, February 29, 1932 at 5:30 o'clock, God, in His infinite wisdom, saw fit to call from our midst Edith Louise Brown. She was born September 19, 1920 and died Feb. 29, 1932, thus being 11 years, 5 months and 10 days old. During her short stay on earth, Edith made a host of friends, and was loved by all who knew her.
