

REMAINS SENT HOME SATURDAY

Body of Corporal Wright to Rest in
Grave in Old North-Carolina Home
Town, as Per Mother's Request

The remains of Corporal David C. Wright, trumpeter of Co. H, Thirty-Seventh infantry, who was killed by being run over by an army truck near the Johnson farm in South Laredo last Thursday morning, were shipped to his old home in Marshall, N. C., on Saturday evening, a request having been received on Saturday from the grief-stricken mother, Mrs. Melinda Wright, to send the body of her boy back to the old home for interment.

The funeral from the undertaking parlors to the train was with full military honors and a sad procession accompanied the cortege to the station, for Corporal Wright was held in the highest esteem by all who knew him, being a young man who through his cheerful and jovial disposition, made friends with all in whom he came in contact. Many floral tributes from civilian friends were sent to the undertaking parlor and served as mute attestations of the regret felt at his untimely death. — Laredo (Texas) Daily Times. 6/1/17 (NR)
